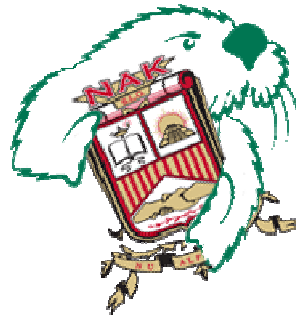

National History

We were formed from a meeting that took place on February 26, 1988 at California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo. Fifteen good friends gathered, of which eleven would eventually become our Founding Fathers. These friends called themselves Nacos – a sometimes derisive term, but at its heart referring to those who give unselfishly and are friendly to all.

These Nacos wanted to demonstrate that they were an important part of the Cal Poly student body. They were enthusiastic about starting a club to help Latino students overcome the culture shock experienced when arriving at a predominantly Anglo university. As their excitement grew, they sought to create structure for their ideas. They decided to form a fraternal cultural organization.

Adapting the term Naco to the university fraternity system, the group officially became Nu Alpha Kappa Fraternity, or NAK for short. Although choosing to adopt the formalized structure of the fraternity system, NAK was – and remains – determined to distinguish itself from traditional "frats" by maintaining a commitment to the ideals of academic excellence, cultural knowledge, and true brotherhood.

The pressures of being the first Latino-based fraternity at Cal Poly were significant. Despite having many supporters on campus, there were also many detractors who anticipated NAK's demise. With steadfast determination, the brothers of NAK persevered.

Their hard work has paid off. Twenty-Two years later, NAK is one of the most respected organizations at Cal Poly – and at each of the 21 other chapters throughout California, Nevada and Colorado that have since joined the NAK familia.

Why Nu Alpha Kappa?

We have a brotherhood that spans beyond normal boundaries. We can go to any of our chapters and feel the brotherhood that is present between brothers at our chapter.

As a NAK, you will have the opportunity to meet different people, not only here at CSU, Monterey, but at other universities. We provide a social network through means of national conferences, community service and social activities.

Through out the years, brothers have entered numerous careers fields in engineering, law, medicine and business, etc. This provides a large business network to undergraduates who are looking for full time careers after graduation, internships or scholarships.

To give back to our communities. We do this by mentoring children, organizing food and toy drives, and providing manpower at several community and cultural events

To enhance your professional qualities, such as leadership, teamwork and communication skills. Conducting meetings and presentations, organizing fundraisers, social events and community services, accomplish this.

What about my Academics?

We understand that you may be concerned your academics while pledging. We recognize that we come to college to learn, and your studies take priority over the business of the fraternity. At no time will we allow another brother's grades to suffer. To keep this in check, we require aca-

demical evolutions from professors during the semester and we have set up study hours during which we all study together as a brotherhood. Many of the brothers are in the same majors, and we rely on others for assistance academically.

What does Nu Alpha Kappa cost?

First of all, we do not have an official house, which we require membership to live in. Our brothers are free to live where ever they wish. This cuts down on the costs of living in a fraternity house. There are chapter dues every semester, but most is covered by fundraising.

What is the purpose of Nu Alpha Kappa?

The purpose of NAK is to promote lifelong brotherhood, leadership, and dedication to the community.
